ANTI-HUMAN TRAFFICKING PROGRAM

OUR COLLABORATIVE APPROACH:

The Salvation Army is honored to serve as the Coalition Manager for the Central Ohio Reach and Restore Coalition, a network of 120 organizations working together to raise awareness and build a strong network of services for trafficking survivors.

OUR IMPACT IN 2022:

- We assisted 511 human trafficking survivors in exiting their exploitation and supporting their individual paths toward healing, recovery, and stability.
- We had 709 encounters with women exploited in commercial sex on the streets of Columbus.
- We provided hotline response for a 14 county area in Central Ohio.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING IN CENTRAL OHIO

Human trafficking is compelled exploitation in commercial sex or forced labor for financial gain of the trafficker. Ohio ranks 6th in the number of hotline calls placed to the National Human Trafficking Hotline. In Central Ohio, men, women, and children are trafficked in numerous sex industry venues such as the streets, hotels, brothels, massage businesses, and private homes, and in labor industries such as agriculture, factories, hospitality, construction, domestic servitude, and cleaning services.

Each year, The Salvation Army conducts over 10 focus groups with survivors to gain insight into effective program design and delivery





HOUSING PROGRAMS

Poverty and homelessness are inextricably linked. In addition to assisting those living in shelter move to safe, affordable housing, The Salvation Army also provides emergency assistance for food, utility, rent and clothing.

The Salvation Army continues to work diligently to provide for the most basic need of safe and stable housing for as many as possible who are living on the edge of, or already experiencing, homelessness.

ADULT REHABILITATION PROGRAM

The Adult Rehabilitation Center served 214 men and provided 13,804 nights of shelter in 2022.



The Salvation Army in Central Ohio operates the Adult Rehabilitation Center (ARC) to assist men focusing on combating dependency on alcohol and drugs. The residential facility located in Columbus provides treatment programs to help men regain health and stability in their lives, build work and social skills, and restore families.

The no-fee, 120-beds facility also includes a thrift store and warehouse where the men go to work each day. The ARC is funded partially from sales at its thrift stores throughout central Ohio.

MATERIAL ASSISTANCE

The Salvation Amy works diligently to make sure needs are being met. Through, our material assistance programs we can help individuals in many ways. We help provide meals to those who are hungry and operate food pantries to help sustain families in need. Through our Christmas Cheer program, we are able to provide toys to families and children in need. We also fight hard to keep families from losing their homes or from having their utilities disconnected. Our material assistance programs are here to make sure that basic needs for our community members are being met.



CHILDREN'S PROGRAMS

The Salvation Army learning centers and day camps for children provide a safe and enriching environment where children can be inspired, learn, and thrive.

Our trained staff and counselors serve as mentors and provide constant attention, and compassion, to ensure that children in Central Ohio have a positive outlet for their talent and creativity, helping them to become better students and members of our community. We also offer character building programs, music lessons, VBS, overnight summer camp, and many other opportunities for children to have a safe place to be themselves.






